JLG ARCHITECTS: DEEPLY ROOTED IN WESTERN NORTH DAKOTA

While Minot may be familiar with JLG Architects' Katelyn Crider, Kelli Hammer, and Nate Ziegler, most don't know that this small team is part of a large pool of talent, with over 200 employee-owners spanning North Dakota, South Dakota, and Minnesota.

JLG has had a team in Minot for 11 years but has worked on projects in the region for nearly 35 years. The Minot team is small but mighty – backed by a combination of virtual and physical connectivity to all western North Dakota and Midwestern projects. Crider, Hammer, and Ziegler have made their mark, transforming western North Dakota with master planning, design/build, and renovations for countless clients. More recent work can be seen at Minot State University, First Western Bank & Trust, Minot Park District facilities, First International Bank & Trust, and the latest renovation at the new Minot City Hall.



When JLG opened its doors in North Dakota three decades ago, the firm had just two founding owners, a dynamic duo that laid the foundation for the firm to eventually expand to over 200.

In 2014, JLG transitioned to 100% employee ownership, giving all employees equitable share in the company and the autonomy to spread out where they wanted to be and needed to be. For most of JLG's Minot team, this meant being able to live in the vicinity of their hometowns to pursue their passion for elevating the everyday Main Street.

JLG's Katelyn Crider, AIA, LEED GA, was raised in Kenmare, ND and attended NDSU to pursue her architecture degree. After graduation, she married her high school sweetheart, and the two established their home in rural Donnybrook, ND, where her husband operates and manages his farm. While Crider works on complex, award-winning projects of every scope, she's proven that big talent can live and successfully work in the smallest of communities (pop.74).

"I love that I get to live on the farm, work in Minot, and design projects throughout western North Dakota; I'm grateful to have the virtual and physical capabilities to be everywhere I need to be," said Crider. "It was always my plan to establish a home near my hometown – but still be able to impact the entire region with functional and aesthetic architecture, creating a better built environment for my neighbors, family, and friends close to home."

Nate Ziegler, JLG's Construction Specialist, CSI, CDT, CCCA, LEED GA, relocated from Colorado 12 years ago to plant his roots in Minot. Although Ziegler didn't grow up in the area, his parents are from Devils Lake, so he was very familiar with the region. His father graduated from Minot State Teachers College in the 60s, prior to moving to Colorado. "I have family throughout North Dakota and have always enjoyed spending time here. Moving to Minot was a simple choice. However, I never anticipated working alongside so many dedicated and very talented individuals; all striving to heighten their profession and create incredible projects within their communities."

JLG's CEO, Michelle Mongeon Allen, also grew up in the area, in Towner, ND, just 45 miles from Minot. Just like Crider, Allen was raised in a rural, agriculture-centered community, and her dedication to growing western North Dakota has been a driving force for the firm. Allen has been steadfast in making sure the firm remains true to its roots and committed to their communities in every way, from emerging professional mentorship to volunteerism and pro bono projects for non-profit organizations.

Kelli Hammer, JLG's Construction Specification Writer, moved from Indiana to North Dakota in 2014. She has lived in oilfield housing in Tioga, spent a year working in Williston, and now proudly calls downtown Minot her home. "Some people think Minot is small, but I came from a town with a population of less than 500 and lived on a farm 30 miles away from the closest grocery store," explained Hammer.

Hammer is involved in several volunteer and community organizations, striving to make her community a better place for everyone. She has given her time to the local homeless shelter, raised money for local charities, and worked in the Scandi Kitchen at this year's Norsk Hostfest. "Being able to volunteer and be part of a community is a new experience for me," said Hammer. "Instead of taking care of livestock and daily chores, I'm taking care of my environment, where I live. I want where I live to be a place where everyone feels welcome and cared for. This feeling begins with designing around peoples' lives and who we are as a community in Minot. I'm so proud that JLG gives me the tools to make a local impact."
